Day 1 April 2, Monday: Depart for Ireland

Depart Newark Liberty International Airport via United Airlines for our transatlantic flight to Dublin, Ireland. Complimentary dinner, breakfast and beverages will be served on the flight. (D,B)

Day 2 April 3, Tuesday: Arrive in Dublin | Belfast Orientation Tour | Titanic Belfast

Arrive at Dublin Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and a Peter's Way tour manager will meet us as we exit from Customs. Board our motor coach, and we will be on our way to Belfast, Northern Ireland's Capital (*two and a half hour bus ride*). Enjoy an orientation tour of Belfast, including the Falls Road sites, Bobby Sands Mural, and the Peace Wall. Visit Titanic Belfast, a site that recreates the story of the world's most famous ship. Stop at Belfast Castle for a photo opportunity. Independent lunch. Check-in at hotel in Belfast and balance of the day at leisure. (D)

Day 3 April 4, Wednesday: Armagh & Downpatrick

Irish buffet breakfast at hotel. This morning we leave Belfast to visit Armagh, the spiritual capital of Ireland for 1,500 years and the seat of both Protestant and Catholic archbishops. St. Patrick called Armagh "*my sweet hill*" and built his stone church on the hill where the Anglican Cathedral now stands. On the opposite hill, the twin-spired Catholic Cathedral, started in 1840, is flanked by two large marble archbishops who look mildly across town. **Participate at the 10:00 am scheduled Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral, sung by Sacred Heart Church Choir. Fr. John Alvarado will concelebrate.** Late morning, drive through 'St. Patrick Country' to the historic town of Downpatrick, the traditional burial place of Saint Patrick. Independent lunch. We will visit Down County Museum and experience the recently restored 18th century County Gaol; stories of the convicts; the county's history; St. Patrick and early Christianity. We will also visit St. Patrick's Centre, an exciting interpretative exhibition that tells the fascinating story of Ireland's Patron Saint. Return to our hotel in Belfast. (B,D)

Day 4 April 5, Thursday: Giant's Causeway | Derry

Irish breakfast at hotel. This morning, we leave Belfast and drive north to visit the Old Bushmills Distillery which is the oldest licensed whiskey distillery. A visit commences with a short film on the history and distillation, followed by a 20-minute tour and finished in the distillery pub where all are invited to try a wee Bush (*Bushmills Whiskey*). Continue on to Giant's Causeway, formed more than 60 million years ago. Red-hot lava erupted onto the surface of the earth and was quickly cooled by the sea, which crystallized it and formed it into the 40,000 basalt polygonal columns. The Causeway is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Independent lunch. We continue to Derry. Derry is situated between the sea and mountains, on the River Foyle which eventually flows into a large fjord. Derry was created as a symbol of the Plantation of Ulster. Check-in at hotel in Derry. (B,D)

Day 5 April 6, Friday: Sligo | Knock | Galway

Irish breakfast at hotel. After breakfast, enjoy a guided walking tour of Derry. Pass St. Augustine's Church, a charming and small Anglican church located along the city walls. Continue to the Bloody Sunday Memorial and the Guildhall. Then, we leave Derry and drive to Sligo. An inspiration for Yeats, the lakes of Sligo, with their still waters and wooded islands, are truly spectacular and form a remarkable contrast to the county's rugged uplands. Independent lunch in Sligo. Continue to Ireland's National Marian Shrine in Knock. The Story of Knock began on the evening of August 21, 1879 when the Virgin Mary, St Joseph and St John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of the church at Knock. There were fifteen official witnesses to the apparition who watched and prayed for two hours in the pouring rain. Since then, this Marian Shrine has attracted millions of pilgrims each year from all over the world. The special message of Knock is the need for Penance. **Fr. John Alvarado will celebrate Mass in the Chapel of the Apparitions. We will also attend the blessing of the sick at the Basilica of Knock, sung by Sacred Heart Church Choir.** Late afternoon continue to Galway, capital of the west, affectionately known as "The City of the Tribes." (B,D)

Day 6 April 7, Saturday: Kylemore Abbey | Connemara | Galway

Irish breakfast at hotel. Today, enjoy a tour of the Connemara Region. Visit the majestic Kylemore Abbey, located in the Kylemore Pass in Connemara, originally built by a wealthy English doctor, Mitchell Henry, as a gift to his wife. The house came into the hands of Benedictine religious sisters in 1920 and was a boarding school for girls until 2008. Enjoy a tour of the Abbey. Facilities at Kylemore include a visitor center, gift shop, restaurant, and an exhibition housed in the main reception rooms of the house and a video, which takes the visitor through the history of the house and its occupants. Independent lunch. Visit the country of *The Quiet Man* and *The Purple Taxi*—two famous films made in this region. Connemara is a land

of lakes and rivers, bogs and mountains. It is a land of small villages, where Gaelic is still the spoken language and little has changed little since the beginning of time. It is without a doubt the wildest and the most romantic part of Ireland. Connemara is a vast peninsula bordered by the arid and rocky coastline of Galway Bay in the south ~ a land characteristic for its thatched cottages and stonewalled gardens. The northern shore, has spectacular views of the ocean and the beautiful fjord of Killarney Harbor, as well as the steep mountains overlooking numerous lakes and large bog areas. Connemara is a real paradise for nature lovers. **Attend 6:00 pm Vigil Mass at Galway Cathedral (The Cathedral of Our Lady Assumed into Heaven and St Nicholas), sung by Sacred Heart Church Choir. Fr. John Alvarado will concelebrate.** (B,D)

Day 7 April 8, Sunday: Cliffs of Moher | Bunratty Castle Dinner

Irish breakfast at hotel. Today, we leave Galway and drive through the spectacular Burren Region. 'Boirean' is Irish for 'Rocky.' It got its name from its polished limestone landscape. It is a glaciokarstic plateau with porous carboniferous limestone and shale systems. It is hard to believe that it was once lightly wooded and covered in soil. At the end of the Stone Age, nearly 6,000 years ago, farmers arrived. The farmers left their animals grazing and this, along with natural weathering, stripped the soil of vegetation leaving this rocky landscape behind. The whole area is heaven for geologists and botanists with its rich liana and fauna. Stop at the Cliffs of Moher. The most majestic cliffs in Ireland rise from the Atlantic Ocean at 215 meters and extend for over seven kilometers. From this height, we can admire the Aran Islands and the Connemara Mountains, and listen to the many sea birds that colonize this place from springtime on. Independent lunch en route. Continue to Limerick for hotel check-in. **This evening, enjoy a Medieval banquet at Bunratty Castle. We will be greeted by a kilted piper, then cross over the drawbridge and join the Earl of Thomond for a festive banquet at this majestic 15th century castle. Enjoy an evening filled with music, excellent food, drink and cheer!** (B,D)

Day 8 April 9, Monday: Clonmacnoise | Dublin | Festive Dinner

Irish breakfast at hotel. Today, we leave Limerick for Dublin. On the way we will visit Clonmacnoise, a monastery founded by St. Ciaran in 548-9. Dermot, a local prince, helped Ciaran build his first church on the site and later when Dermot was elected High King, he richly endowed the monastery. Although St. Ciaran did not live long after the foundation, the monastery grew rapidly. Clonmacnoise was a great centre of learning, and many manuscripts, including the Annals of Tighearmach and the Book of the Dun Cow, were written here. The Normans attacked Clonmacnoise in 1179, and burned 105 houses, and for the next four hundred years the monastery was often plundered. In 1552 the English garrison from Athlone took all the monastic valuables away. The monastic site never recovered from this attack. The on-site guides provide excellent tours to the many interesting artifacts to be found here, including the High Crosses, the 12th century round tower, and the many Churches and Temples, which adorn this hallowed site. Independent lunch. Continue to Dublin to visit Trinity College and view the 8th century illustrated manuscript, *The Book of Kells*. **This evening, enjoy a festive group dinner at The Merry Ploughboy Pub in Dublin.** The show kicks off at 8:30 pm and is a highly entertaining performance of live traditional Irish Music, Song and Irish Dancing. The very best of fresh Irish food is served. We are sure to depart with a few Irish tunes in the heart! (B,D)

Day 9 April 10, Tuesday: Dublin Highlights | At Leisure

Irish breakfast at hotel. This morning, we will explore Dublin's "*Fair City*" and take in all the sights, including the famous '*Doors of Dublin*,' the elegant Georgian squares, and Phoenix Park. Highlights of the tour will be a visit to Trinity College, to view the 8th century illustrated manuscript, *The Book of Kells*, followed by a visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral, made famous by its former dean, Jonathan Swift (Dean of St. Patrick's 1713-1745), author of *Gulliver's Travels*. The cathedral, built in 1213, is the largest in Ireland. This Gothic Cathedral, with a splendid interior, is adorned with funeral monuments, such as the Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Dean Jonathan Swift. The Chancel has ornate stained-glass windows, some by Harry Clarke, which are magnificent features. Independent lunch. Time will be given to explore on our own. We recommend a stroll down Grafton Street, to enjoy the best in street entertainment. The shopping is also great in this area of the city! Perhaps visit the Guinness Storehouse to see how this famous brewery was established and how the popular black brew is created, and savor a sampling. **Option (at additional cost): Afternoon tea at the Westbury Hotel** (Irish food served as well). The number of people will determine if a private room may be booked. (B,D)

Day 10 April 11, Wednesday: Return to the USA

After breakfast, transfer by coach to Dublin Airport for our flight home. (B)

AIRLINE SEATING: Under group airline reservations / contracts, the airlines will provide a block of seats for the group. If you require specific seating as a condition of your travel, it is suggested that you book your airfare individually and purchase the land only package. Upgrades to premium economy, business class, or first class may be available but oftentimes airlines will not allow the upgrades until time of ticketing (approximately 30 days prior to departure). Group reservations may not be accessible online for advance check-in/boarding passes/seat assignments. Airline guidelines vary. Please contact our office for specific details.

LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: Land Only packages do not include any portion of the group airfare. **All airline tickets will be your responsibility to book independently.** A passenger choosing the land only portion of the package (**10-Day Ireland program: \$2,095.00 per person sharing a twin room.**) must notify Peter's Way Tours, in writing, 100 days prior to date of departure or a penalty fee will be assessed. Please be advised, passenger(s) opting for the Land Only package or who are deviating from the group itinerary will be responsible for their own transfers to/from hotel/airport. However, if you arrive at the same time or earlier than your group, you are welcome to join the group on the bus. Additionally, if you purchase your own air transportation and the group does not materialize or you cancel your package for any reason, Peter's Way Tours will not be held responsible for the cost of your airfare.

DEVIATIONS & ITINERARY CHANGES: Peter's Way Tours is pleased to assist clients with changes in itineraries. All deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 90 days prior to departure. Deviation fee will apply plus an airline change fee per person. Your routing and dates requested will determine if a difference in airfare will also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact our office for detailed information.

TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Round-trip airport transfers are included for passengers who purchase the full air and land package. Porterage of one piece of luggage throughout your tour at hotels is also included.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin bedded rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout your tour. Matrimonial (full) bedded rooms are subject to availability and must be requested. Triple rooms may be available but we discourage triple room accommodations because they are normally not spacious and there is no discount for triple occupancy. Triple rooms usually are regular twin or matrimonial (full) bedded rooms with a rollaway bed added. Single rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of **\$495.00 for 10-day program / \$150 for extension.** While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin bedded rooms and may be located away from the group. We will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If a single room must be assigned due to your roommate's cancellation, incompatibility or for any other reason (even at the last moment or while on tour), we must charge you the tour's single supplement or pro-rated amount.

MEALS: *10-Day Program:* Breakfast and dinner daily, including a **Medieval banquet at Bunratty Castle and a special dinner show with live traditional music and Irish dancers at The Merry Ploughboy.** Beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at set menu dinners. *2-Day Extension:* Breakfast daily.

GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES: Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Northern Ireland's currency is the pound sterling (£), while currency in the Republic of Ireland is the Euro (€). For good work, recommended (but voluntary) tipping to your tour manager is 4.00 Euro per passenger per day; to the driver is 2.00 Euro per passenger per day; for the local guides 1.50 Euro per passenger per day. Tips for the tour manager and bus driver are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave 1.00 Euro per person for the waiters after each meal and 1.00 Euro per person per day for the maid/bell boys.
